Dean Broadhurst confirmed that there was no change in the waste types being received, there were no changes in the operational area being worked or the machinery to do so. Input tonnages remained similar to the last meeting. Tipping is now taking place in tiers using a bund wall methodology which was explained at the meeting.

Nigel Bowen confirmed that Red were excited to be about to breakthrough the £1 million pound barrier of monies from the LCF given to local good causes. As per Dean's comments he elaborated on the tipping methodology using tiers/terraces. Furthermore, he confirmed that 2019 would see site development and movement into a new tipping area, the CQA plans for which would be with the EA early in the new year.

Laura confirmed that the revised audit date of the site with respect to Odour Management Plan would be in January 2019.

## Red Industries Landfill Communities Fund Update December 2018

### OVERVIEW

At the last Red Industries Landfill Communities Fund Committee Meeting in August, we approved over £115,000 for new projects. These projects will have a significant impact, and provide real benefits to the local and wider community. The people we have spoken to are extremely grateful for the funding as it has allowed them to improve services, extend facilities, and support people in the local area.

Since the fund began, over **£910,000** has been awarded to community projects in the local area. We have supported 28 organisations, across 33 different projects – including churches, community centres, scout groups, football clubs, play parks and more. We are receiving a number of applications for each review round and are continuing to actively promote the fund. We have continued to award most, if not all, of the money available in the fund at each Committee Meeting.

### UPDATE ON PROJECTS

As an update on the projects completed/ nearing completion since the previous meeting:

**Newcastle Ladsandads Football Club** – security improvements including installation of fencing around the football pitches, plus signage and new goal posts to replace broken ones. The security improvements will help reduce the anti-social behaviour and issues including drug paraphernalia, fires, motorcross bikes, litter etc. The project is well supported by the local community and residents. The project is now complete and has been well received by the club and the local residents.

**Wolstanton Bowling Club** – Repairs to roofing and viewing area. The repairs will improve the facilities for the members of the bowling club, snooker players, and also for the community who use the facilities. The viewing rail has been installed and work has started on replacing the roofing.

**Porthill Cricket Club** – Creation of three new training net bays. This will keep people training safe and also provide an area for practice when games are being played. The bays can also be used for PT sessions and other activities. The bays are not complete and an official opening event is being planned for the start of the cricket season next year.

**67<sup>th</sup> Burslem Scouts** – New windows and doors are in and project almost complete. More will be announced once project is completed.

### NEW PROJECTS

In the last Committee Meeting, we approved funding for another six projects, totalling over £115,000.

The successful projects are currently going through the DET/ ENTRUST registration process. More information will be provided on which projects have been successful, and the amount, in the next Liaison Group Meeting.



## **FUTURE APPLICATIONS**

The next Red Industries Landfill Communities Fund Committee Meeting is in January, new applications should be submitted by 7<sup>th</sup> January to be considered in the meeting.
